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## Owner Occupied Rehabilitation (OOR) is a Resident-Focused Home Repair Program Designed to Assist Low- to Moderate-Income Families

- Funding Source: Indiana Office of Community and Rural Affairs (OCRA)
- Max Amount of Award: \$350,000
- Local Match Requirement: 10%
- Application Window: mid-January to mid-February
- National Objective: Benefit Low- to Moderate-Income Residents - Housing






#### **HOME INSPECTIONS**

**(JULY- AUGUST 2025)** 

A licensed home inspector will visit homeowners at their residence to determine a scope of work

Radon testing is a new requirement for this program



#### **CONSTRUCTION**

**(OCTOBER 2025 – OCTOBER 2026)** 

A licensed home inspector and Certified Grant Administrator will oversee the implementation of construction activities

Outdoor projects will be prioritized

A final inspection will take place to ensure quality of work

Homeowners whose applications score the highest, according to a scoring matrix, will be selected for income verification

The following documents must be provided as part of this process:

- Proof of Homeownership
- Certification of Employment, etc.





After the income verification and home inspection are complete, a Certified Grant Administrator will begin a local procurement process for contractor services

Typically, 4-5 firms are selected based on their area of expertise

Close out paperwork is filed by Certified Grant Administrator



## **Communication Plan**

- Homeowners will be by updated at each stage of the program lifecycle
- From the income verification process to construction, clear and consistent communication with homeowners is crucial
- Communication Tools: SurveyMonkey, Textedly, Facebook, phone, mail

- Construction is the cost of improvements for homes
- Professional Services: licensed home inspections (initial & final), radon testing (required), and lead testing (as needed), and financial services (preparing owner contracts), etc.
- Environmental Review includes the cost to conduct a 2 Tier Review of each home.
- Grant Administration includes project management costs, grant draw downs, program monitoring and reporting during and after grant period.



## **Key Public Engagement Activities**

These activities are critical for conveying community need

### 1. Survey

- Designed to garner public interest and encourage program participation
- Survey-takers are asked to:
  - Demonstrate support for the program
  - Share details about their unique improvements needs and how those issues are affecting their households and lives
  - Provide information on their household composition
  - Self-report their annual household income

#### 2. Public Hearing

- Required for application submission
- Two public hearings will need to be held, once at application and once at closeout

#### 3. Letters of Support

- 3-5 Letters of Support are needed for a strong application
- Residents and Directors of Community Foundations, Human Service Agencies, and EDCs are welcome to apply
