## **ORDINANCE NO. 2023-01**

## AN ORDINANCE OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRANKLIN, INDIANA CLARIFYING ORDINANCE NO. 2015-04

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Franklin, Indiana ("Council") previously implemented a city-wide pension compensation plan for all civilian employees and all merit police officers and merit firefighters; and

WHEREAS, the Council passed Ordinance No. 2015-04 on December 7, 2015 which amended the pension compensation plan for merit police officers and merit firefighters to receive a one-time incentive payment ("Incentive Payment") after completing twenty (20) years of employment service with the City of Franklin, Indiana ("City"). A copy of Ordinance No. 2015-04 is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to clarify and restate the parameters and application of the one-time Incentive Payment consistent with its existing terms; and

WHEREAS, to avoid any doubt, the Council wishes to state clearly that the Incentive Payment is not to be considered as salary, but simply as a one-time incentive pay; and

WHEREAS, to avoid any doubt, the Council wishes to state clearly that the City's obligation to make any one-time Incentive Payment under Ordinance No. 2015-04 is initially triggered in 2023 and for no year prior to 2023.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Franklin, Indiana, as follows:

- Section 1: The above recitals are incorporated herein by this reference as though fully set forth herein below.
- Section 2: As described in Section 1(a) of Ordinance No. 2015-04, in addition to salary and other benefits, merit police officers and merit firefighters employed by the City and hired on or after January 1, 2003, shall be entitled to a one-time Incentive Payment after completing twenty (20) years of service with the City.
- Section 3: The Incentive Payment shall be equal to twenty percent (20%) of an eligible merit police officer's or merit firefighter's wages earned during that employee's twentieth (20th) year of employment with the City and shall be paid in the year following completion of the eligible merit police officer's or merit firefighter's twentieth (20th) year of employment with the City.

In the year in which an eligible merit police officer or merit firefighter Section 4: receives his or her Incentive Payment, that employee shall not be eligible to receive an additional one-hundred dollar (\$100.00) payment for each year of employment with the City, as provided by Ordinance No. 08-07(b)(i).

The Incentive Payment is only available to merit police officers and merit Section 5: firefighters that meet the requirements described in Ordinance No. 2015-04 and clarified in this Ordinance, and such eligible employees may only receive one Incentive Payment during the course of their employment with the City. To avoid any doubt, the Incentive Payment is a one-time incentive payment and is not considered part of a merit police officer's or merit firefighter's yearly salary or a longevity increase as stated in Indiana Code section 36-8-1-11.

To avoid any doubt, the City's obligation to make any Incentive Payment Section 6: to an eligible merit police officer or merit firefighter is initially triggered in 2023 and for no year prior to 2023

All provisions of Ordinance No. 2015-04 shall remain in full force and Section 7: effect. This Ordinance expressly does not amend, alter, repeal, or nullify any provision in Ordinance No. 2015-04, and only seeks to clarify Ordinance No. 2015-04.

The terms, paragraphs, sentences, words, policies, and procedures of this Section 8: Ordinance are severable, and if a court of competent jurisdiction hereof declares any portion of this Ordinance unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the remaining portions thereof.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption. Section 9:
